# Ayatul Kursi (Ayah 255 of Surah Al-Baqarah) with Detailed Tafsir (Explanation)

## The Ayah:

#### **Transliteration:**

Allah! There is no deity except Him, the Ever-Living, the Sustainer of existence. Neither drowsiness overtakes Him nor sleep. To Him

belongs whatever is in the heavens and whatever is on the earth. Who is it that can intercede with Him except by His permission? He knows what is before them and what will be after them, and they encompass not a thing of His knowledge except for what He wills. His Kursi extends over the heavens and the earth, and their preservation tires Him not. And He is the Most High, the Most Great.

Tafsir (Explanation):

This phrase emphasizes the absolute monotheism in Islam. Allah (God) is the only true deity, and there is no one and nothing else worthy of worship or reverence. This statement solidifies the foundation of the faith—**Tawhid** (Oneness of God).

(The Ever-Living, the Sustainer of existence) الْحَيُّ الْقَيُّومُ .2

• (AI-Hayy): Refers to the eternal, ever-living nature of Allah. His life is not like the life of any creation; it is perfect and unending, without beginning or end.

• الْفَتُومُ (Al-Qayyum): He is the Sustainer, the One who maintains everything in existence. Allah is independent, and everything depends on Him for its existence and continuation.

3. كَا تُفْدُهُ سِنَةٌ وَلَا نَوْمٌ (Neither drowsiness overtakes Him nor sleep)

This part highlights Allah's perfection. Unlike humans, who experience fatigue, drowsiness, or sleep, Allah is free from such limitations. He is ever-conscious, aware, and vigilant, and nothing causes Him to become weak or inattentive.

4. لَهُ مَا فِي السَّمَاوَاتِ وَمَا فِي الْأَرْضِ (To Him belongs whatever is in the heavens and whatever is on the earth)

Everything in existence, from the heavens to the earth, belongs to Allah. This shows His ultimate ownership of all that is in creation. Nothing exists outside of His will or control.

5. مَنْ ذَا الَّذِي يَشْفَعُ عِندَهُ إِلَّا بِإِذْنِهِ (Who is it that can intercede with Him except by His permission?)

Intercession is only possible with Allah's permission. Even the most esteemed angels, prophets, or believers can intercede on behalf of others only if Allah grants them the ability to do so. This highlights the absolute authority and control

of Allah over everything, including intercession.

(He knows what is before them and what will be after them) يَعْلَمُ مَا بَيْنَ أَيْدِيهِمْ وَمَا خُلْفَهُمْ

Allah's knowledge encompasses everything—past, present, and future. There is nothing hidden from Him, and He is fully aware of all that occurs, has occurred, and will occur. This shows the infinite scope of His knowledge.

7. وَلَا يُحِيطُونَ بِشَيْءٍ مِّنْ عِلْمِهِ إِلَّا بِمَا شَاءَ (And they encompass not a thing of His knowledge except for what He wills)

Human knowledge is limited and can only reach what Allah allows it to. No one can fully comprehend Allah's vast knowledge unless He grants them the ability to do so.

This emphasizes the infinite nature of Allah's wisdom compared to human understanding.

(His Kursi extends over the heavens and the earth) وَسِعَ كُرْسِيُّهُ السَّمَاوَاتِ وَالْأَرْضَ .8

The word "Kursi" refers to Allah's throne or dominion. It signifies His sovereignty, power, and control over the entire creation. The Kursi is said to encompass the heavens and the earth, which are vast beyond human comprehension. This statement reflects the majesty and might of Allah's reign.

9. وَلَا يَنُودُهُ حِفْظُهُمَا وَهُوَ الْعَلِيُّ الْعَظِيمُ (And their preservation tires Him not. And He is the Most High, the Most Great)

The preservation of the heavens and the earth does not cause Allah

any fatigue or difficulty. Allah's ability to maintain the entire universe effortlessly is a testament to His power and greatness. He is the **Al-Aliyy** (The Most High) and **Al-Azim** (The Most Great), far above any weakness or limitation.
